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Day 2 Hamadan Hamadan is believed to be one of the oldest cities in Iran and even in the world. It is alleged by common people that it was once occupied by the Assyrians in 1100 BCE. The Ancient Greek historian, Herodotus, states that it was the capital of the Medes, around 700 BCE. 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Day 4-5 Isfahan Isfahan is located on the main north-south and east-west routes crossing Iran, and was once one of the largest cities in the world. It flourished from 1050 to 1722, particularly in the 16th century under the Safavid dynasty, when it became the capital of Persia for the second time in its history. In Safavid dynasty, a lot of Armenians emigrated from Armenia to Iran. Even today, the city retains much of its past glory. It is famous for its Persian-Islamic architecture, with many beautiful boulevards, covered bridges, palaces, mosques, and
